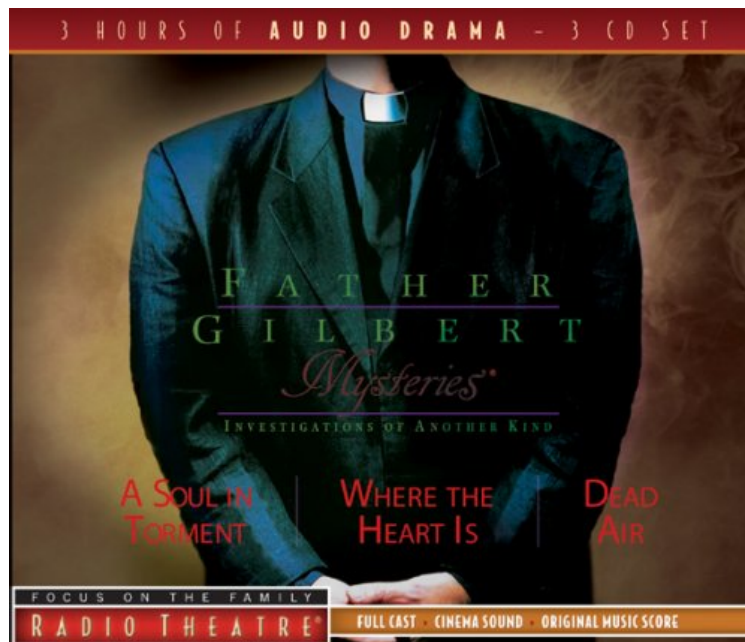

This year we're doing something a little closer to home.We are listening to The Legend of Squanto: An Unknown Hero Who Changed the Course of American History.The CD set brings the story of Squanto alive through the amazing talents of the Focus on the Family Radio Theatre actors.Listening to the voices and sound effects helps us imagine we were right there when Squanto became a slave, traveled to Spain and then England and finally returned home to find his entire tribe gone.Just to be clear, this is not an audio book. It is a radio drama, complete with actors and sound effects. Focus on the Family Radio Theatre always does a superb job of bringing a story to life in our imaginations. Now, as the vicar of an ancient church in a small English village, Gilbert finds himself at the center of one strange mystery after another. Recorded in London with some of England's finest actors, these original audio dramas capture the imagination. Three episodes include A Soul in Torment, Where the Heart Is, and Dead Air.

In THE SILVER CORD his mother warns him of a crime she learns of during near-death experiences; in IN MEMORIAM, after investigating the identity of a mysterious young woman (no crime being involved), he must deal with a crisis of faith. The acting, production, music, and sound effects are thoroughly professional; these could be the audio tracks of network television shows. The religious and mystical aspects might put off skeptics but aren't really outside the mainstream. Overall, the stories intrigue and entertain, though by the end of the second program, Father Gilbert's family secrets begin to seem preposterous. W.M.
