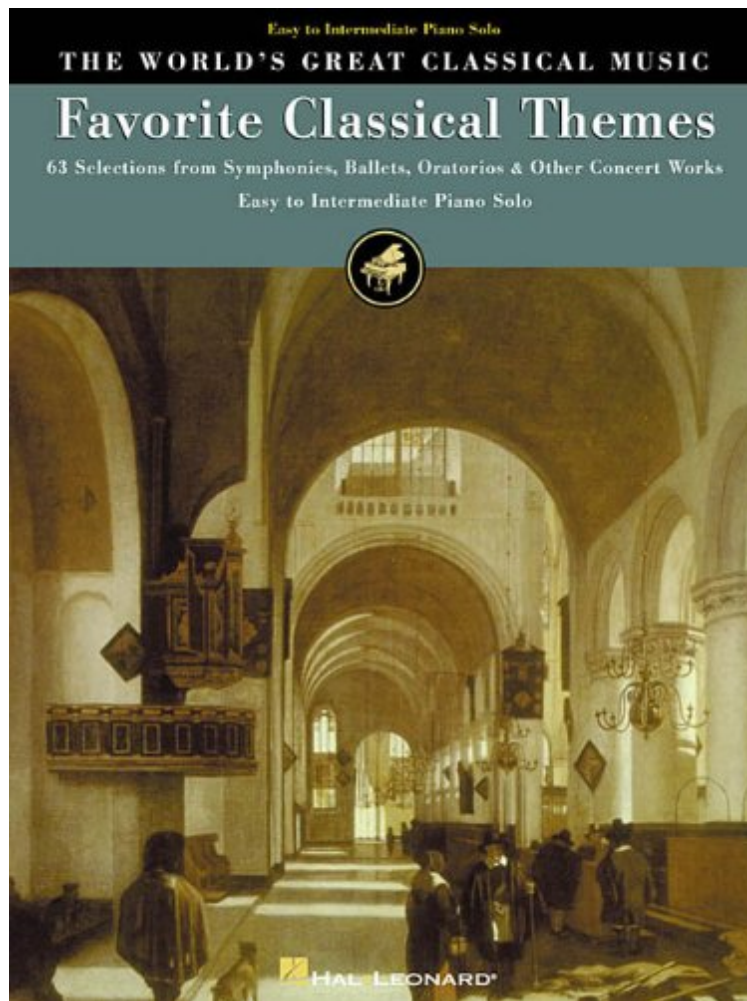

But I wish had shown a "look inside" as there are NO fingering suggestions whatsoever. That might be acceptable for an advanced book, but for easy-intermediate I expect fingering. It just doesn't make sense for Hal

Leonard not to work out the best fingering once during production, instead of having every owner muddle through working it out on their own. I often change the finger a little from what is suggested, but it's usually a good starting point. I bought four of these books (two easy, two intermediate-early advanced), but in future I'll stick with Alfred Publishing books (which not only have fingering, but some nice text up front with a suggested order of study, useful since I'm self-taught now). 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
