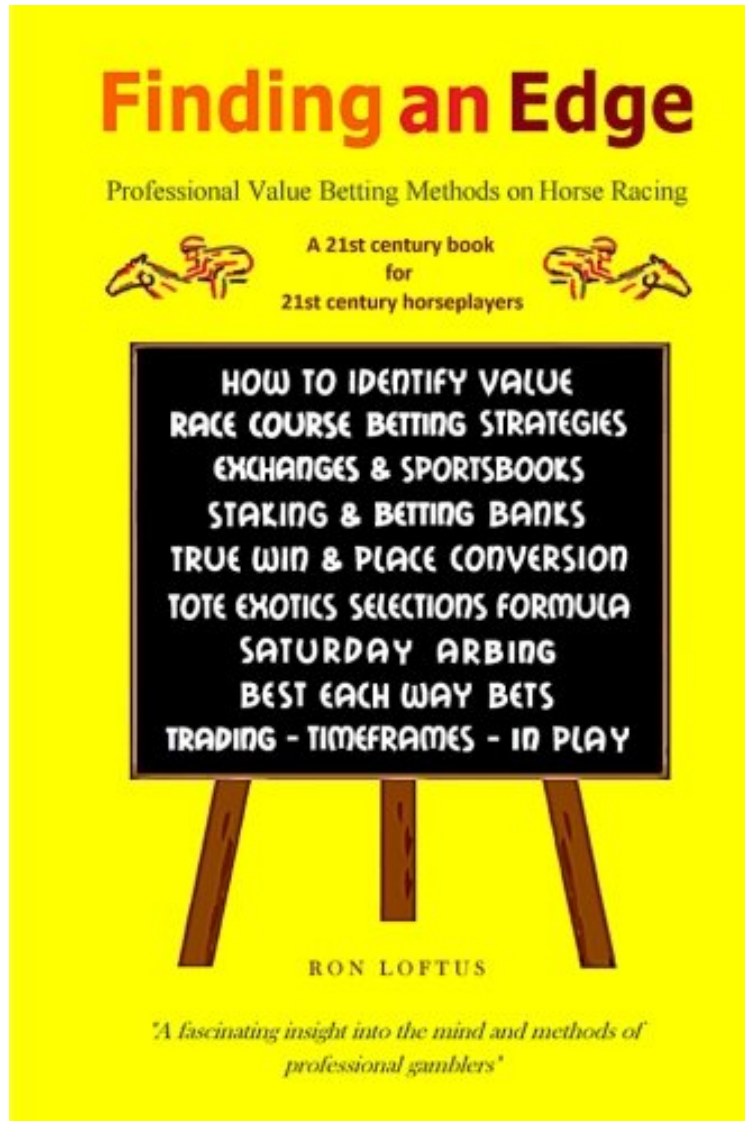

The second thing that I saw was the double-spaced lines. The third thing was that the justification of the margins left gaps between words that approached a quarter inch. The fourth thing were the largish top and bottom margins. The fifth thing was the placement of pictures of sporting silhouettes throughout the "book" for no reason at all. The 130 pages held maybe 25-30 pages of information in a "normal" book. Then the info: not much. There is a lot of anecdotal drivel and then ideas on betting with the bookmaker who gave the best odds. This was obviously not written with the Parimutuel system used in the U.S. in mind. I won't reveal his "methods", but they are weak and IMO won't work. I buy most current handicapping books these days and there are always stinkers like this that prey upon the public's thirst for information. Please save yourself the \$15 and look elsewhere.
