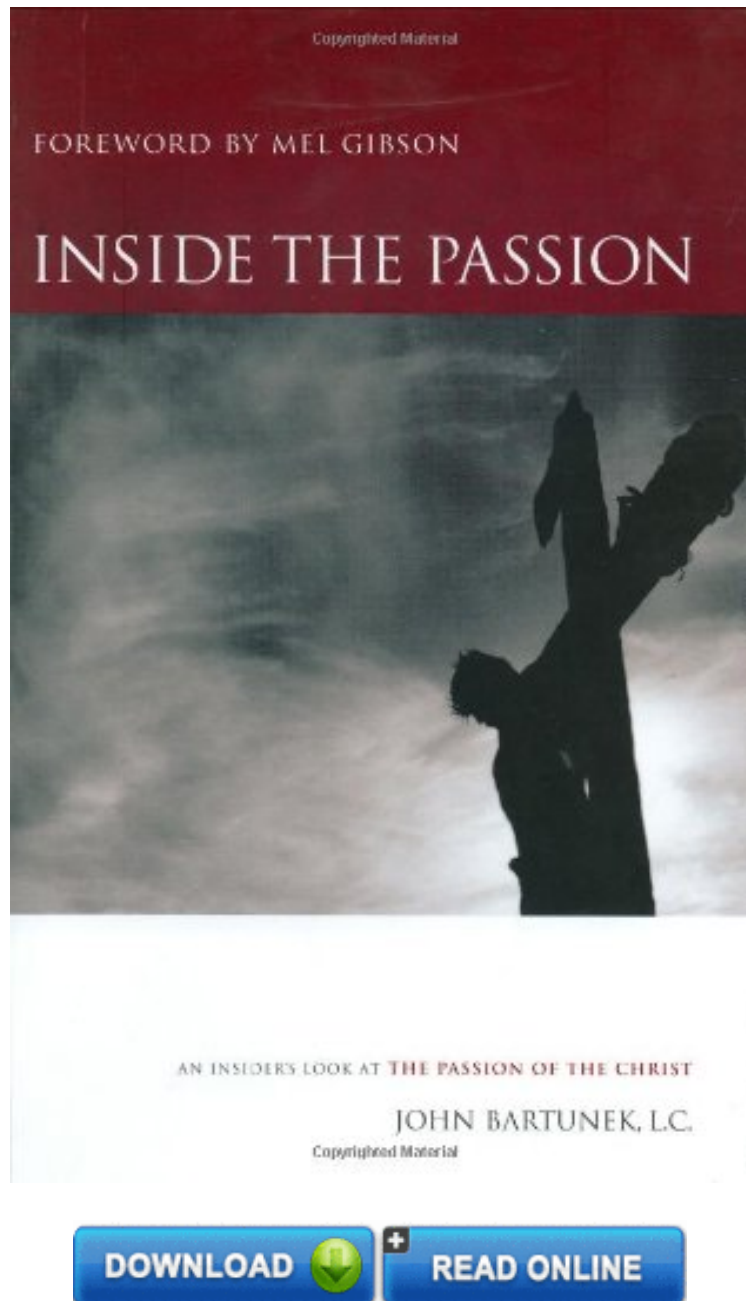

0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. Great book but terrible Kindle format By Customer Unfortunately I purchased the Kindle edition of the book. That is reason for the 2 star rating. The book itself would merit a 4-5 star

rating. For some reason, the file consists of 180+ pages of images, not "Kindle" text. It is as if someone laid the book down on a scanner and scanned each page. As a result, none of the usual features such as search, definitions and web search, etc. are available. This is especially bad for a book like this with many historical and biblical names of people, places, etc. The other problem is that it is very difficult to read on a device with a smaller screen, since the "print" is very small in this format; since an entire one or two pages of the actual book are on your screen at a time. The only way you can deal with this is to use the limited amount of zooming allowed to enlarge the text slightly. Of course the text is not line adjusted, so you must move from side to side as if you were looking at the actual book under a magnifying glass. In my opinion this is a real problem, and it should be noted in the description of the Kindle format.⁶
