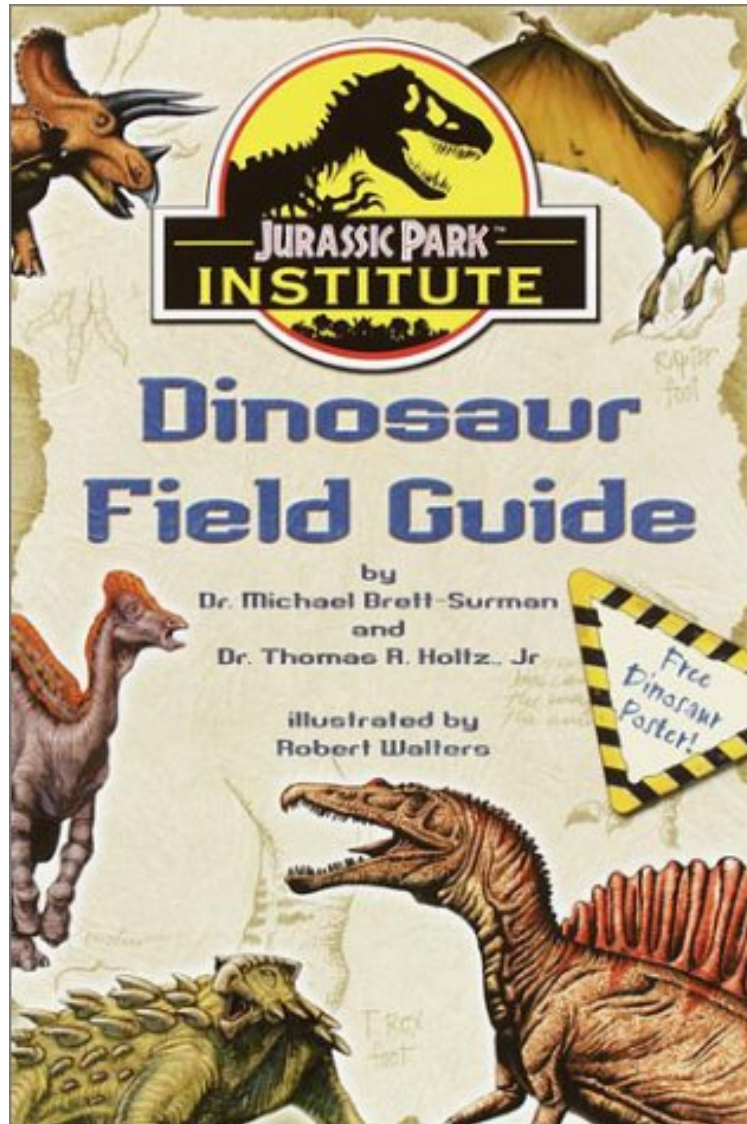

reptilian is given one page of info which includes a couple of paragraphs or so along with a time chart and measurement scale. Also included for each entry is a simplified breakdown of certain stats, these include: Fun Facts, Location, Food, Size, Weight, Friends, Enemies, and Trivia. Other sections of the book include, Maps of Earth in the Mesozoic Era, Dinosaur Discoveries Around the World, Where to See Dinosaurs in Museums, Recommended Books about Dinosaurs, Books for Teachers and Parents, Dinosaur-Related Web Sites, and a Glossary. There are also a few black white photos of dinosaur researchers as well as some short pages on plant life and fossil discovery. This book was written by Dr. Michael Brett-Surman of the Smithsonian Institute and Dr. Thomas R Holtz, a top T. Rex expert. Bought this book for my little brother a few years back when he was all into the "dino" stuff. He seemed to have enjoyed the book, at least for a short while.
