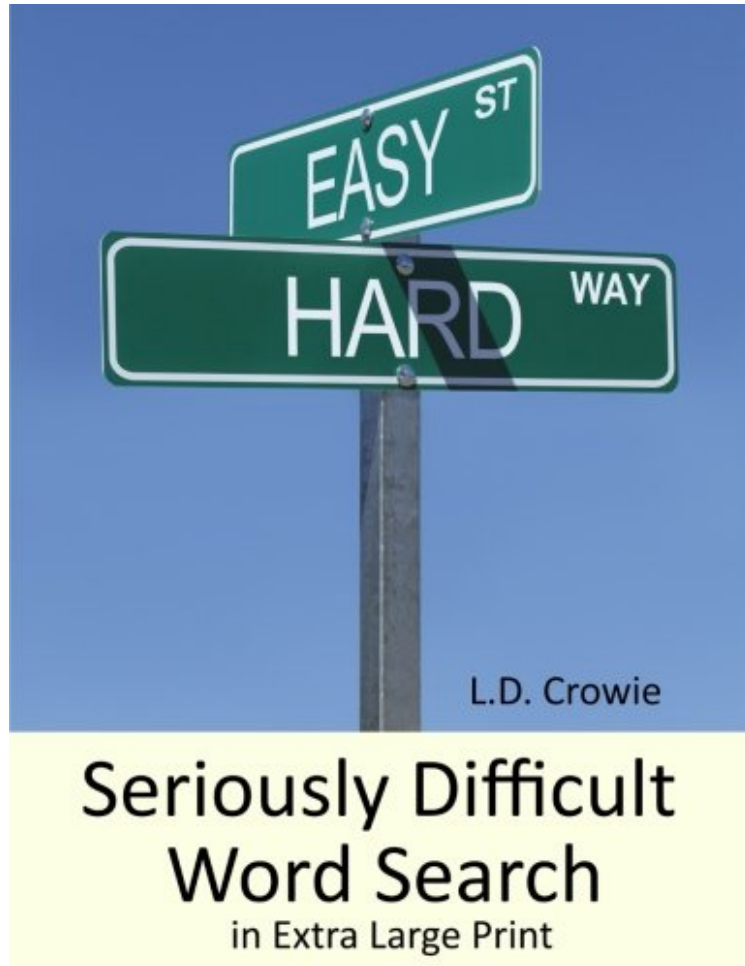

The words are arranged vertically, horizontally and diagonally. They can read forwards and backwards and can, at times, overlap. Formatted in 24 point Verdana this book will provide hours of fun for anyone with very poor

eyesight who wants more of a challenge than conventional word search puzzles can deliver.
